Professional Growth Plans

- a. Professional growth means the career-long process whereby a teacher, school and school jurisdiction leaders annually develop and implement a plan to achieve professional learning objectives and goals that are consistent with their relative professional practice standards.
- b. Teacher Professional Growth Plans Due by October 30, 2023, or by a date requested by your school authority. c. Teachers can use the 'Self-Reflection on My Professional Practice Tool' located on the Professional Growth Planning page under the Professional Development tab. It is a personalized, interactive, digital, bilingual tool that assists teachers and school leaders in reflecting on the knowledge, skills and attributes of their professional practice.

Beginning Teachers' Network

The Beginning Teacher Network is a virtual space to support Alberta teachers new to the profession and/or the province.

The Beginning Teacher Network will have 8 virtual learning sessions this school year. These virtual sessions are an opportunity to connect with experienced teacher mentors and beginning teacher colleagues from across the province. All materials are also offered in French.
